Linda Liebenberg, PhD., is a leading researcher and evaluator in the field of youth wellbeing and community resilience, Adjunct Professor, Faculty of Graduate Studies, Dalhousie University and an International Research Affiliate at the UNESCO Child and Family Research Centre, National University Ireland. She is a researcher and evaluator with a core interest in children and youth with complex needs. Her work explores the promotion of positive youth development and the promotion of mental health, using formal and informal resources, primarily through the development of community resilience and related community resources. As a key component of this work, Linda reflects critically on best ways in which to conduct research and evaluations with children and their communities (including multiple service providers). These approaches include participatory methods (see for example www.youthspacesandplaces.org); sophisticated longitudinal quantitative designs (see for example http://www.youthsay.co.nz/); and the design of measurement instruments used with children and youth (for example the Child and Youth Resilience Measure, CYRM-28).
